


The Case of the Missing Manuscript





It started with a late-night meeting.




I knew I should have left it alone, but being a detective, I was curious. So I began looking for the key.


But inside, I found a beautifully decorated apartment. I looked at the clue again and


I followed the clue and found...






Another piece of paper rolled up like the first.

This clue confused me for a while, but when I looked closer, I discovered...






On the face of the clock, hiding in the number 10, was a tiny envelope with a message!


Congratulations! You have found the clue! Perhaps you will succeed


THE NEXT CLUE:

My heart was beating wildly after finding that last clue. I took a minute to gather myself and then followed the clue.








A microscopic QR code on the BEAD of a necklace! I quickly scanned it with my smart phone.









EDGE of the table!









A rather soggy note. With my magnifying glass, I read it.






Congratulations! You have found the clue. Don't give up! You're

Click the key.


I quickly unlocked the briefcase.








Directions:

VERY IMPORTANT: Follow the directions at the bottom left corner of each page.


Use the treble clef letter names to decipher the clues and solve the puzzle of the missing manuscript. Use white boards or paper. This can work individually or as a team game.
